*W*aterford was founded in 914 AD

The name Waterford is derived from an Old Norse word Vadrarfjodr that can be traced back to the late 9th Century.

Vadrarfjodr is believed to come from the meaning windy fjord, this meaning brings reference to the fact that Waterford was a safe haven for Viking ships sheltering from a windy Irish Sea.

The Vikings soon realised the trading and strategic importance of the three rivers which empty into Waterford harbour. They built a “longphort” or dock at the confluence of the St. John’s River

*H*istory at the Reg

We here in the Reg, have also cast our net far and wide to bring our patrons and visitors not only the best Irish Whiskies and Irish Craft Beers from the 32 counties of Ireland but also what we consider to be the best libations from around the world.

Just one other historic footnote on Waterford Cities taverns from 1566 – in that year, the GREAT PARCHMENT BOOK confirms that due to the actions of unscrupulous tavern owners who increased the sale of wine by employing “naughty corrupt women to the greater offence of God and the dishonesty of the whole city” that the City Fathers “ordained that from the 20th day of June next never more shall any woman, maid, wife, wench or widow be a wine Tavernier or a wine drawer in any place within this city or suburbs upon pain of £5 in money”.

While we don't subscribe to this rule all year round, we do honour it, here in the Reg, on the 20th June each year. So if you're served a glass of wine on that day by one of our female staff it's on the house.

Classic Cocktails

“Cock-tails stimulating liquor, composed of spirits of any kind, sugar, water, and bitters—it is vulgarly called bittered sling, and is supposed to be an excellent electioneering potion, in as much as it renders the heart stout and bold, at the same time that it fuddles the head. It is said, also to be of great use to a democratic: “because a person, having swallowed a glass of it, is ready to swallow anything else “ - Harry Crosswell 1806

Mojito

€6.90

“ A classic Cuban cocktail originating in the 1800's, The Mojito was first used as a cure for illness among the locals, mint and lime were used to hide the crudeness of the 18th century rum know as fire water back then”

Old Fashioned

“Traditionally, the first use of the name "Old Fashioned" for a Bourbon whiskey was said to have been, at the Pendennis Club, a gentlemen's club founded in 1881 in Louisville, Kentucky. The recipe was said to have been invented by a bartender at that club in honour of Colonel James E. Pepper, a prominent bourbon distiller, who brought it to the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel bar in New York City.

Old School Mai Tai

“Maita'i" is the Tahitian for "good" but the drink is spelled as two words, The history of the Mai Tai is covered in mystery, "as two famous tiki bar chains claimed to have invented the original, here at The Reg we used the one we liked the most and packs a punch.”

Margarita

“Once again a drink’s history is faded but our guess is that someone substituted tequila for brandy in the classic cocktail The Sidecar and has never looked back”

Whiskey Sour

“Elliot Stubb, an English steward of a ship named Sunshine, who allegedly mixed Irish whiskey, Key lime juice, syrup, and ice cubes to create the cocktail in a bar, in 1872 and were glad he did.”

Clover Club

€6.90

“The Clover Club Cocktail is a drink that pre-dates Prohibition, and is named for the Philadelphia men’s club of the same name, which met in the Bellevue-Stratford hotel. Containing Gin, Lemon juice, raspberry syrup and whites this was a big hit among the playboys of

Philadelphia”

Espresso Martini

€6.90

*“The exact history of the Espresso Martini is not definite but one theory suggests the drink was first created by cocktail guru Dick Bradsel in 1984 a famous model came into Fred’s Bar, and crassly asked him to make her a drink that would “wake me up, and then f*** me up” and Dick’s subsequent creation was the first espresso martini.”*

Cosmopolitan

€7.90

“Not as old as the others but still a classic, many associate the Cosmopolitan with New York City but it originated on the west coast in San Francisco in the 1970s and its popularity grew from there”

Daiquiri

€6.90

“A cocktail we all know by name but do we know the history?”

Invented in 1898 in Santiago, Cuba. Named after a coal mine where Jennings Cox the creator worked as an engineer, its popularity grew during prohibition when alcohol was banned in the U.S.A Cuba was a short flight from Florida where the Rum was a plenty.”

Piña Colada

€7.90

“If you like getting caught in the rain and you're not into yoga this drink is for you!” The name Piña Colada means strained pineapple. Ramón 'Monchito' Marrero Pérez claims to have first made it at the Caribe Hilton Hotel's Beachcomber Bar in San Juan on 15

August 1952. It's the national drink of Puerto Rico”

French Martini

“This cocktail is another new classic coming from the late 1980's this time from New York City, this is a sweet fruity drink made using Vodka, black raspberry liquor and pineapple juice. Simple and seductive.”

The Long Island Ice Tea

€8.90

“Us Irish love our tea so it's no wonder this cocktail is a favourite among the Deise locals with its mix of five sprits lemon juice and cola. Originating in the U.S.A around 1961.”

Michael Collins

€7.90

“A classic cocktail called the Tom Collins gets an Irish spin by using Blackwater gin with lemon, sugar and soda water, in honour of Michael Collins who was shot dead in 1922 during the civil war in Ireland.”

Thomas Francis Meagher

Thomas Francis Meagher (August 3, 1823 – July 1, 1867) was a brave Irish man who was willing to give up his life for the sake of freedom and equality.

Meagher's Father, Thomas Meagher, was the first post reformation Catholic Mayor in Ireland. They lived in a gracious old mansion on the Quay, now the Granville hotel, which is where Meagher was born and spent his childhood.

He unveiled the Irish Tricolour for the first time in March of 1848 from the Wolfe Tone Club in Waterford City

- *Sentenced to be hung drawn and quartered for sedition following Young Ireland rebellion.*
- *Delivered his famous defiant speech from the dock*
- *Sentence commuted and banished to Tasmania for life.*
- *Escaped from Tasmania to a hero's welcome in New York,*
- *Became a prominent lecturer and newspaper editor in New York,*
- *At the outbreak of the American Civil War Meagher formed Company K of the New York 69th Infantry regiment. (The Fighting 69th)*
- *Meagher's Irish Brigade fought with distinction throughout the course of the war and gained praise from friend and foe.*
- *After the war Meagher would become acting governor of and develop the first constitution of Montana a major step towards statehood.*
- *Died in mysterious circumstances on 1st of July 1867*
